This workshop invites theoretical and empirical contributions exploring these phenomena, both individually and through their intersections. Particular attention will be given to issues such as gender, digital technologies and information systems, labour and professional mobility, migration, organisational practices, and the social and economic implications of informality.

Given the complexity of these processes, the workshop encourages interdisciplinary dialogue and welcomes contributions from economics, human resource management, psychology, sociology, law, information systems, management and related fields. Its aim is to deepen our understanding of how informality, mobility and migration are evolving, how they interact, and what challenges and opportunities they create for individuals, organisations and societies.

By bringing together different theoretical approaches, methodological perspectives and empirical contexts, the workshop aims to deepen our understanding of how informality, mobility and migration are evolving, how they interact, what drives them, whom they affect, and what challenges and opportunities they create for individuals, organisations and societies.

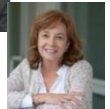
